

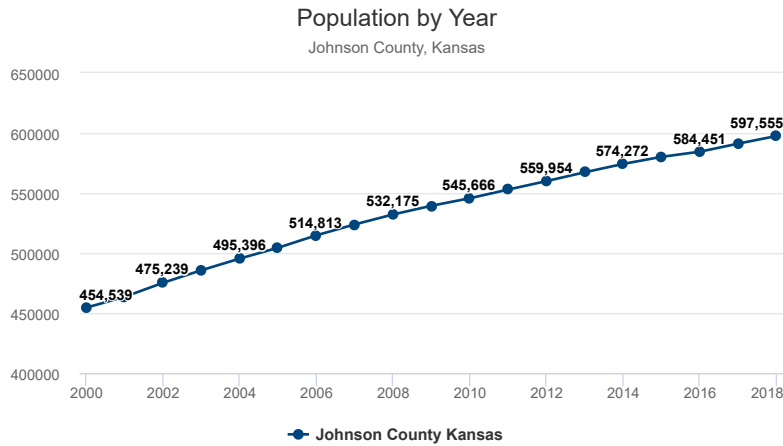

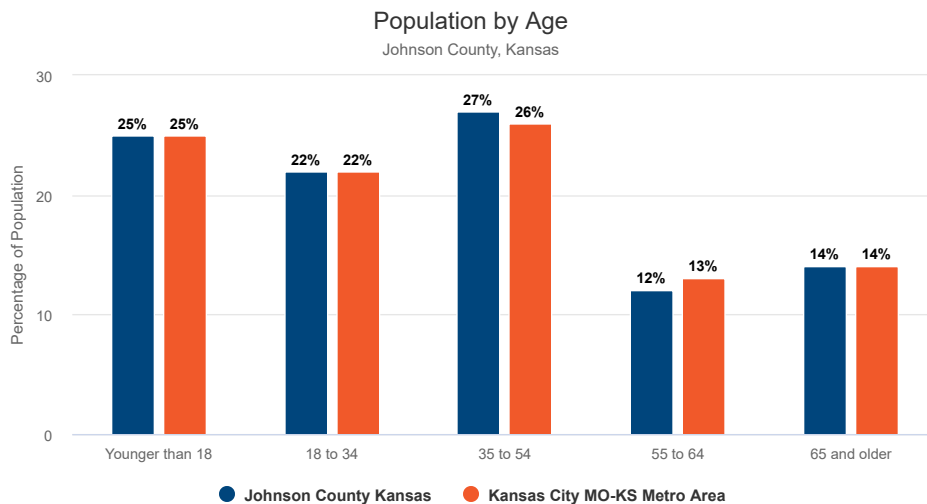

Population by Year



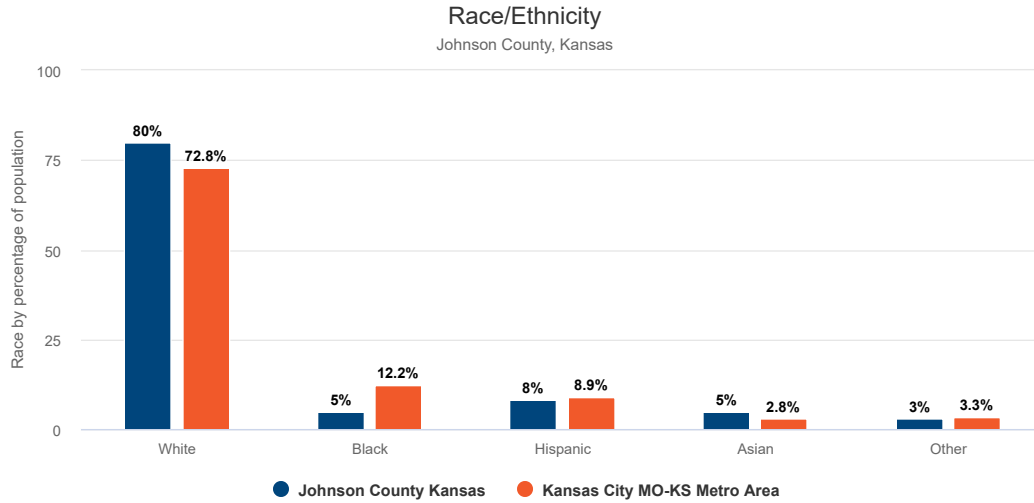

Population by Age



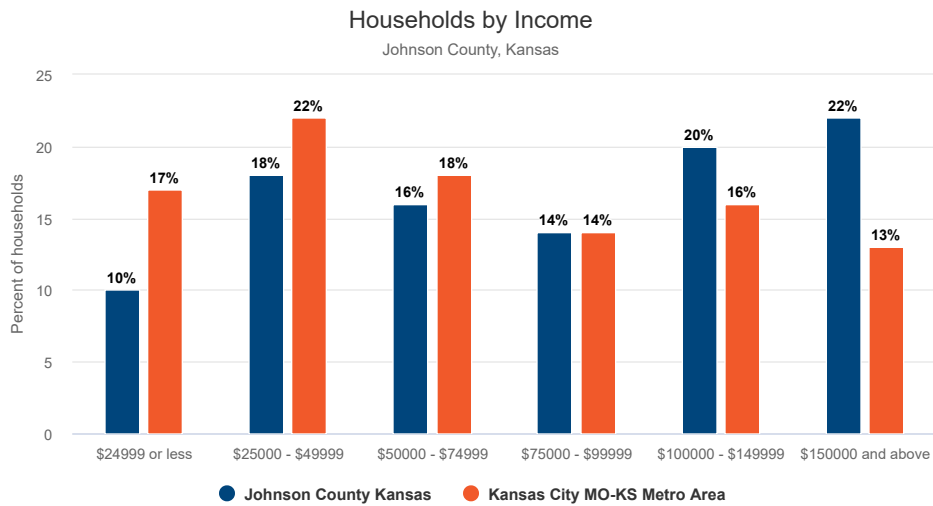

Race and Ethnicity



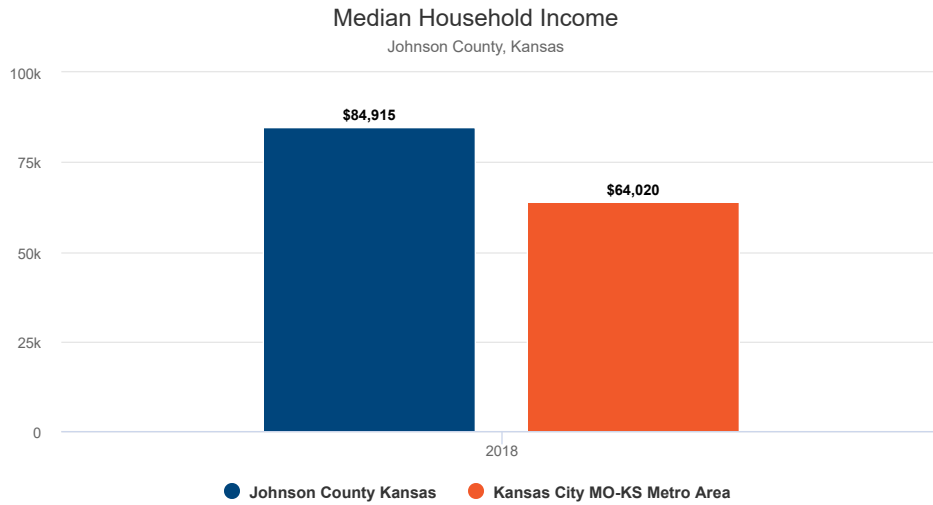

Language Proficiency

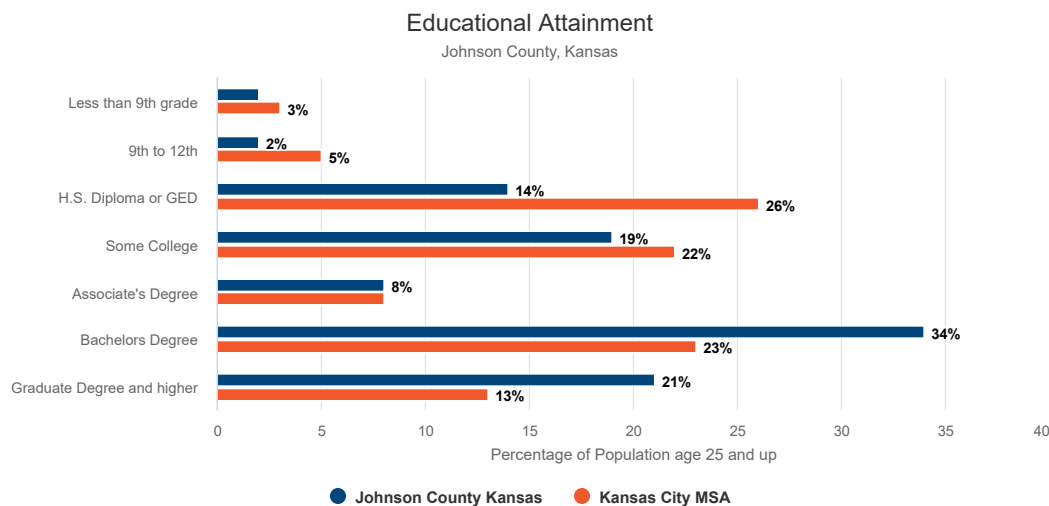

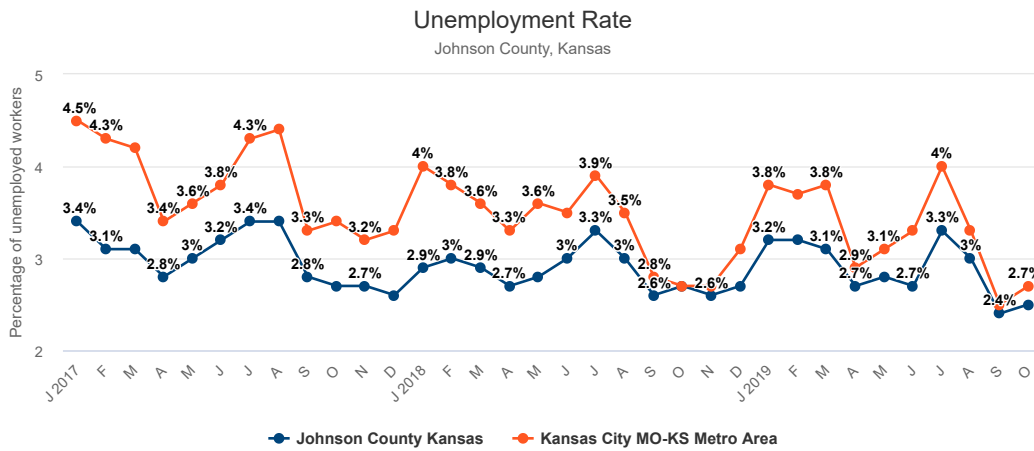
Workforce Commuting Patterns

Johnson County residents who commute to jobs outside the county	111,381

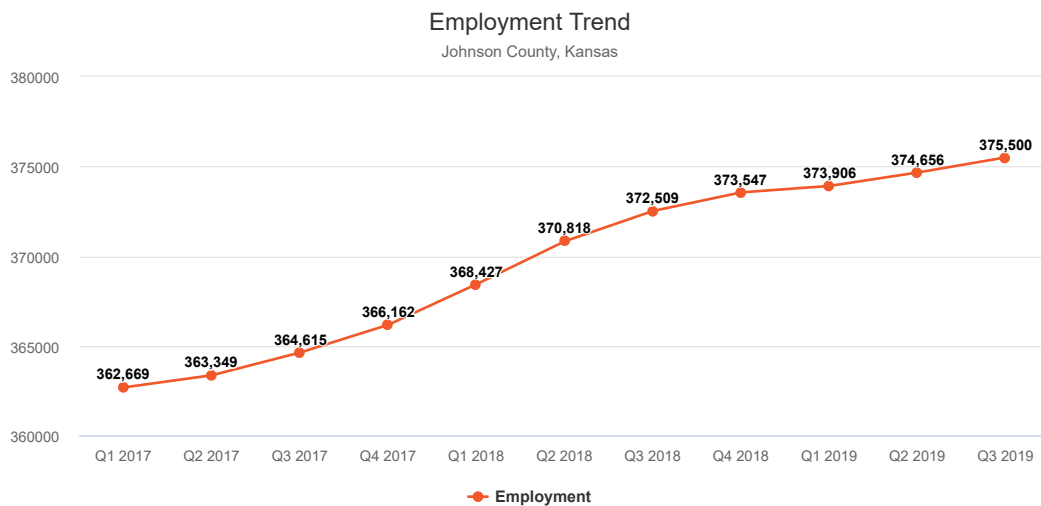

Unemployment Rate



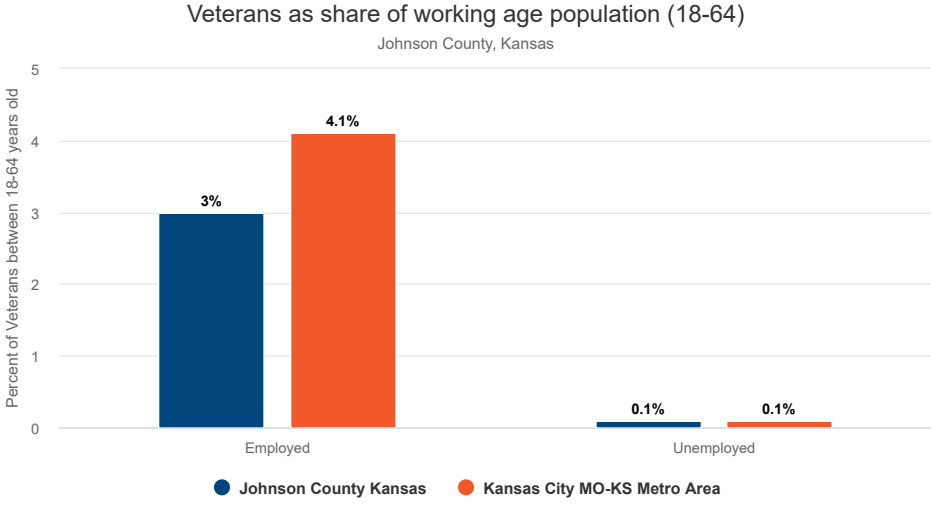

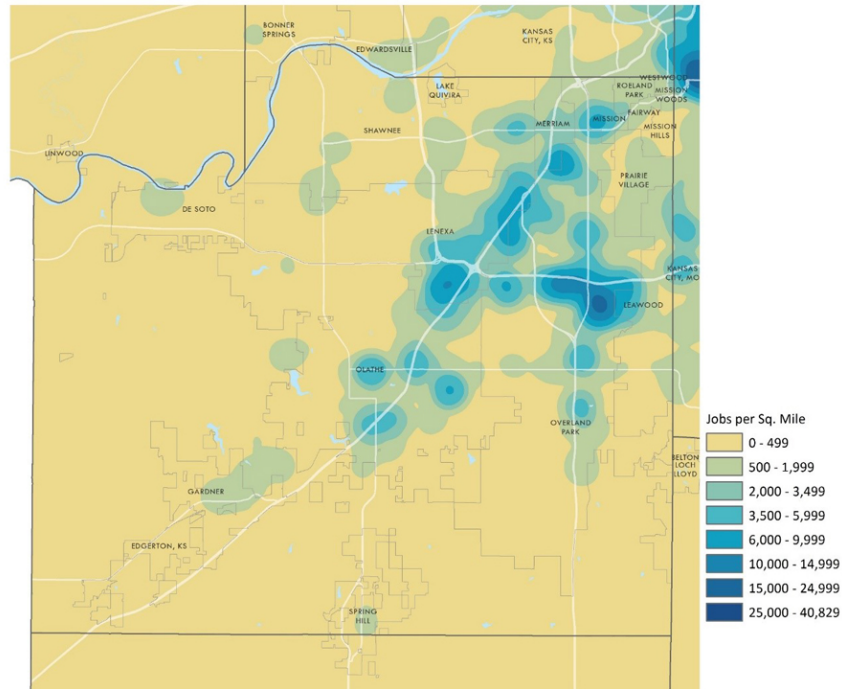
Employment of Veterans

Competitive Industries

Johnson County's top 10 competitive industries are listed by their location quotient. A location quotient shows how the county compares in a particular sector to national numbers. A quotient of one means the county has the same percentage of its workers in that industry as the nation. A number below that means the percentage is lower than the national number, and a number greater than one means the county has a higher percentage of workers employed in that sector.

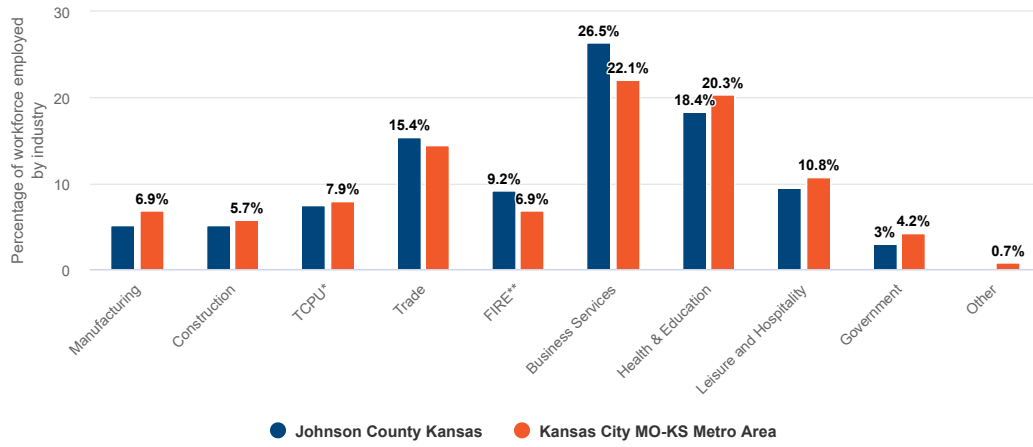
